## All One One All Farm's 2024 Artist in Residence Applications Now Open

The 14-acre nonprofit farm and education center seeking artists for the 2024 season

**December 21, 2023 (Goshen, NY)** All One One All (AOOA) Farm has announced the details of its second annual Artist in Residence program. The farm invites artists to join its vibrant community by applying for the six-month residency, which runs from April through September and culminates in a fall art show.

Throughout the residency, artists visit the serene and picturesque farm weekly to create farm-inspired art using the medium of their choice. The thoughtfully designed silvopasture farm employs evidence-based regenerative agriculture practices and is home to thousands of trees, a vegetable garden, an apiary, heritage breed chickens, livestock endangered heritage Karakul sheep, two resident dogs, and its beloved mascot, a Toulouse goose named Bilou Bilou.

Ashlie Blake, AOOA's 2023 artist in residence, says, "AOOA farm is so magical! And because it is a regenerative farm, meaning every single thing works together in harmony... it is teeming with life. Constant inspiration abounds!"

"At AOOA, our work extends beyond the fields and kitchen and encompasses a vibrant community of individuals passionate about the interplay between nature, agriculture, and art," says Alix Daguin, project director at AOOA. "We invite artists of all ages and skill levels who share our enthusiasm for exploring biodiverse and productive landscapes to join us!"
